







In April of this year Lotus became the all-time grand prix winner with 50 victories, surpassing Ferrari. For Emerson Fittipaldi it was his third win of the year and his ninth since joining Colin Chapman and his Lotus team in 1970. Last year Fittipaldi and his John Player Special captured the World Championship, the fifth world title for Lotus in the past decade.
